

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS

OTTAWA, Wednesday, October 2, 2024 (98)

The Standing Senate Committee on Transport and Communications met this day at 6:49 p.m., in room B45, Senate of Canada Building, the deputy chair, the Honourable Julie Miville-Dechêne, presiding.
