# Publication bans (s.486.6 (1))

# **Trends in charges**

From 2016/2017 to 2020/2021, 10 charges were completed in adult criminal courts for failing to comply with an order related to a publication ban for victims or witnesses under section 486.6 (1) of the *Criminal Code* (Table 1). Most charges (six) were stayed or withdrawn, three were found guilty during this five-year timeframe and one was acquitted.

#### Trends in cases

In Canada, seven cases were completed in adult criminal courts where the Most Serious Offence (MSO) was failing to comply with an order related to a publication ban under section 486.6 (1) of the *Criminal Code*, between 2016/2017 and 2020/2021 (Table 2). Three cases were stayed or withdrawn, three were found guilty and one was acquitted.

## Breach of a SOIRA order (s.490.031)

### Trends in charges

From 2016/2017 to 2020/2021, 2,579 charges were completed in adult criminal courts for a breach of an order under the *Sex Offender Information Registration Act* (SOIRA) under section 490.031 of the *Criminal Code* (Table 3). Nearly two-thirds of the charges (1,677) resulted in a guilty verdict while one-third of charges (881) were stayed or withdrawn.

#### Trends in cases

In Canada, a total of 1,872 cases were completed in adult criminal courts between 2016/2017 and 2020/2021 where the Most Serious Offence (MSO) was a breach of a SOIRA order under section 490.031 of the *Criminal Code* (Table 4). The majority of cases resulted in a guilty verdict (1,449) while 409 cases were stayed or withdrawn, nine were acquitted and 5 counted as 'other decisions'.

### Providing false or misleading information to the Registry (s.490.0311)

# **Trends in charges**

From 2016/2017 to 2020/2021, 12 charges were completed in adult criminal courts for providing false or misleading information to the Registry (SOIRA) under section 490.0311 of the *Criminal Code* (Table 5). Four charges resulted in a guilty verdict while eight charges were stayed or withdrawn.

In Canada, a total of 5 cases were completed in adult criminal courts between 2016/2017 and 2020/2021 where the MSO was providing false or misleading information to the Registry (SOIRA) under section 490.0311 of the *Criminal Code* (Table 6). Three cases resulted in a guilty verdict while two cases were stayed or withdrawn.
