



In keeping with a long history of diverse, discipline-spanning thought leadership, the Royal Society of Canada (RSC) struck a <u>task force</u> in April 2020 to assist in Canada's response to and recovery from the pandemic. To accomplish this, the Task Force took two approaches that have engaged over 750 experts in all fields of research, scholarship, and the arts. In keeping with longstanding RSC practices, participants do not have to be members to lead or engage in RSC initiatives.

Expertise in the Public Interest Through Partnership

The first approach was to establish a series of expert committees mandated to produce detailed, <u>peer-reviewed reports</u> on a broad array of subjects relating to scientific and social issues associated with COVID-19. The first Policy Briefing, "<u>Restoring Trust: COVID-19 and the Future of Long-Term Care</u>," was published in July 2020. To date twenty-six resources have been produced, all freely available <u>online</u>.

To ensure broader distribution of the reports, we partnered with FACETS – Canada's first and only multidisciplinary open-access science journal. In August 2020, FACETS published the long-term care report as the first in a <u>series</u> devoted to RSC Policy Briefings.

Our Policy Briefings have generated over 110,000 downloads from the RSC and FACETS websites.

The second approach was the preparation of short, rapid response "informed perspectives", through a unique partnership between the RSC and the Globe and Mail. To date, over 100 rapid-response pieces have been published in the Globe and Mail, and the average number of reads per article is about 4,000.

Beyond peer-reviewed Policy Briefings and informed perspectives, the RSC has produced collections of essays on Indigenous Health and Wellness and on the Impacts of the Pandemic in Racialized Communities. A <u>website</u> has also been developed showcasing the response of Canadian artists to the pandemic.

Internationally, the RSC continues to contribute to declarations by the G7 and G20, in multilateral fora in Austria, Singapore, and Nicaragua, and other international initiatives to support the effective use of expert advice in public policy.

Our work in support of Canada's response to the pandemic has continued apace. Upcoming Policy Briefings are focused on urgent themes, including:

#### Vaccine Town Halls

On December 12, 2020, the Editorial Board of the Globe and Mail wrote "It would really help to have some top scientists and physicians leading a national conversation, to explain to Canadians how the vaccines were approved, how they work, what the dangers are and for whom, and how and why any downsides are vastly outweighed by the benefits."

In response, and beginning in January 2021, The RSC and the Globe and Mail organized a series of virtual <u>Town Halls</u> on COVID-19 vaccines open to all Canadians. Over 10,000 Canadians participated.
