Your Excellency Ambassador Zeller,

Distinguished guests,

It is a pleasure to welcome you to Parliament and to the chambers of the Speaker of the Senate, where we are gathered to welcome His Excellency Philippe Zeller, France's Ambassador to Canada. He presented his credentials to our Governor General, His Excellency the Right Honourable David Johnston, on September 19, 2011, slightly more than a year ago.

Before coming to Canada, Your Excellency served as France's Ambassador to Hungary from 2004 to 2007, and to the Republic of Indonesia from 2008 to 2011. Your honours include being an Officer of the Legion of Honour and of the National Order of Merit of France.
