Speaking Notes The Honourable Noël A. Kinsella Speaker of the Senate

On the occasion a farewell reception in honour of Her Excellency the Governor General and His Excellency Jean-Daniel Lafond

Ottawa September 28, 2010

Your Excellencies, Speaker Milliken, Honourable Senators and Members of the House of Commons, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Welcome to Parliament and to the Hall of Honour, where we are gathered this afternoon to honour Their Excellencies Michaëlle Jean and Jean-Daniel Lafond.

As the Speaker of the Senate of Canada, it is a great pleasure for me to convey, on behalf of my honourable colleagues in the Senate, our fondest expression of gratitude to Their Excellencies.

The service of our Governor General to Canadians from coast to coast to coast has been marked by a profound determination to foster positive change. Her Excellency will long be remembered not only for her hopeful strength, but for the depth and warmth of her compassion. These are attributes for which Canadians have a great appreciation. On September 27, 2005, Her Excellency's investiture ceremony was held in the Senate Chamber. It was my great pleasure to attend that ceremony and to hear Her Excellency set forth the course she intended to navigate during her tenure as Governor General. It was an address delivered with great eloquence, humour and passion. Her Excellency spoke of her desire to protect the environment, to promote Canadian culture and to provide young people with more and better opportunities.

It was clear to those of us in attendance that we were in the presence of a stirring communicator, one with the rare gift of speaking from the heart.

That has certainly been the case with our Governor General. I cannot begin to put into words what Her Excellency's dignity, warmth and compassion have meant to the families of our Forces. It has not simply been Her Excellency's generosity of time, but more importantly, her generosity of spirit.

As an Honorary Captain of the NAVRES, I shared in your pride in witnessing Her Majesty's Canadian ships arrive in Haiti shortly after disaster struck. These ships were loaded with as much in the way of supplies as they could carry. Along with the essentials, including first aid, generators and food, were many donations, such as clothing and toys. I have heard that the response, in terms of donations on the part of Canadians, was and continues to be, overwhelming.

Perhaps this speaks to the closeness that Canadians feel with Her Excellency, that her pain was our pain, and her strength and perseverance was our cue to act and commit our resources to this monumental humanitarian cause.

Truly Her Excellency is the embodiment of the best of the Canadian dream: proud and cognizant of her roots, willing to share her manifold talents with those around her for the betterment of her community, strong, hopeful and determined, yet graceful and empathetic.

On behalf of the Senate and all Canadians, it gives me great pleasure to wish you both the very best in your next pursuit. It has great challenges, but there is no question that Your Excellencies are equal to the task.
