Representatives from the National Assembly of the Kingdom of Lesotho,

High Commissioner,

Honourable Parliamentarians,

Distinguished Guests:

It is a pleasure to welcome the Right Honourable Sephiri Enoch Motanyane, Speaker of the National Assembly of Lesotho, and his delegation to Canada, to our Parliament and to the quarters of the Speaker of the Senate. These rooms are those of Her Majesty the Queen or the Governor General when they visit Parliament.

Your visit to Canada is part of what has been called parliamentary diplomacy, the use of parliamentary visits and exchanges as a means by which to improve relations between countries and, with the trading of ideas, as a mechanism to improve the operation of our governments.

During these visits, we often look for points of common interest. One commonality is that Lesotho is one of the few African countries to see snow on a regular basis. These range from engaging Canada's parliament in helping to strengthen your democracy, governance and rule of law to learning about the uses of information technologies in your parliament. We are honoured that you thought of us when seeking to reach your objectives.

We look forward to assisting you in any way possible and to forming warm and lasting friendships. Certainly, a bit of snow, in whatever month it falls, will not cool these relationships.

In closing, it is my pleasure to propose a toast and I ask that you raise your glasses: To parliamentary diplomacy, to the success of this visit by our distinguished guests and to the good health of everyone in our gathering today.
