Mr. President, Fellow Parliamentarians, Members of the Diplomatic Corps, Ladies and Gentlemen,

My wife Ann and I are delighted to welcome you this evening to this very special celebration, "Toronto: the World within a City", and to share with all of you our pride in the diversity of our country.

Likewise, this meeting of the OSCE PA, indeed the OSCE PA itself, would not be the same without the contributions of each and every one of you. I salute you for your work thus far and hope that you may continue for years to come to fulfill your duty as parliamentarians to the citizens of your respective countries.

On behalf of the Senate of Canada, I would like to express my gratitude to all of you, to all of the nations and cultures here tonight, for meeting here in Toronto and enriching us beyond measure. I very much look forward to opportunities in the future to strengthen the friendship between our countries, our peoples and our parliaments.
