SPEAKING NOTES THE HONOURABLE NOËL A. KINSELLA SPEAKER OF THE SENATE

ON THE OCCASION OF A CEREMONY TO AWARD THE ORDRE DE LA PLÉIADE

Mr. Speaker of the House of Commons, Ambassadors, Minister, President and members of the Canadian Branch of the Assemblée parlementaire de la Francophonie, Honourable senators and members of Parliament, Distinguished recipients, Ladies and Gentlemen,
